Math: This week we are going to take a deeper understanding of arrays and construct arrays to larger numbers. We will also then discuss arrays that have one array, square array, and multiple factors to make the array. This will lead our discussion to prime and composite numbers of 100. Students will be given multiplication cards and sort them into piles of facts they know and don't know. If they don't know I am looking for a strategy they can use to solve. Also, take time to practice these facts so students become proficient in these facts.

Reading: Students will be finishing up writing their newsletters on Lou Gehrig. We are also working on this week summarization and sequence of events. End of the week the students will present a summary of one book they have read in the past year.

Science:
