Math: We will be continuing to look for different strategies students can use to find the products to basic multiplication facts. We are also working on using our math vocabulary words when we talk math. Students have learned about the commutative, zero, and identity property of multiplication. We are also working on the distributive property of multiplication. Look for patterns in numbers and begin to explore some different strategies to solve basic division problems. Take time to have your child explain to you what these different properties are. To help promote problem solving, ask your child, "What strategies are you going to use

Reading:

The next story the students will be reading is **Donovan's Word Jar.**

Through out this lesson the students will be learning about prefixes, suffixes, root words. synonyms and antonyms. They will also be working on making inferences and summarizing during this story. We will have a review on Thursday Sept. 120th. Friday Sept. 21st students will be taking a computerized test over the story of Donovan's Word Jar. The test will consist of vocabulary and comprehension

Science:

Our class is moving into our animal unit. The students will learn about classification, adaptation, food chains, and much more that deal with animals needs. This will help students identify why certain animals live where they do or how they survive in their environments. After we have covered these topics we will move on to students researching and presenting one animal to there class.

Social Studies:

We will honor Constitution Day which is on Mon. Sept. 17. Students will be reading at home about the constitution. They will need to highlight 8 things they learned from the reading and bring back on Monday. We will be writing about this on Monday. To continue to with the constitution day we will learn about the branches of the Government. Then begin a map packet on the Midwest region using an atlas for information.

Language: We will continue to learn how to build a complete sentence which includes a subject and predicate. By the end of the week students should be able to pick out the subject, predicate, noun, and verb in a sentence. Also, we will continue to work on Daily Oral Language.


